LUTHER B. LUST

Luther B. Lust, a great friend of our Nevada Alumni Association, died June 29, 2012 at the age of 93. Our tribute to him as a teacher, principal, superintendent, advisor, and friend follows:

Mr. Lust attended Lykens school for 7 years and later graduated from McCutchenville High School in 1936 where he was class president. He received his bachelor's degree in math and science at Ohio Northern University in 1940. [As an aside, Eddie Ritterspach was at ONU at the same time.] Mr. Lust taught for 2 years at Sulphur Springs where his future wife, Alice Gingery, was a freshman at that time.

He was drafted into the Army, December 5, 1941. He went to Officer's Candidate School and then was assigned to the 93rd Ordinance Maintenance Company. He served in the North African, Italian, French, and German campaigns, including experiencing seeing the Dachau concentration camp before moving on to Salsburg, Austria. He was there when the European part of WWII ended May 8, 1945.

Mr. Lust left the Army as a captain and returned to civilian life. While looking for a teaching job, he again met Alice Gingery, but this time in the Crawford County School Superintendent's office where she worked. They began courting and married in 1946. He taught at Carey for 2 years in addition to attending The Ohio State University from 1946 - 1948 where he received his Masters Plus in School Administration. He was Superintendent of Nevada Schools from 1947 through 1963. After the consolidation, he became Principal of Wynford Schools for many years and retired from his career in education in 1976 as Secondary School Supervisor with the Crawford County Schools.

Mr. Lust always enjoyed farming with his father and later with his son, Kenneth. He was a member of the Nevada Lions Club, Nevada American Legion, Rotary of Bucyrus, and attended the Retired Teachers Association's gatherings. He enjoyed golf, Euchre, traveling, along with following local and professional sports.

His son, Kenneth lives in Sycamore where he farms and his daughter, Sharon Lust Schnell, lives in New Bremen, OH where she is a pharmacist at St. Mary's Hospital. Mr. Lust enjoyed 4 grandchildren and 4 great grandchildren.

Mr. Lust had a significant positive impact on the lives and education for most of us in this room. As this is our first banquet since his death, we are reminded of the void in the Nevada/Wynford community. He is missed!!
